Assemblyman Louis D. Greenwald

Assemblyman Louis D. Greenwald has been a life-long resident of the 6th Legislative District. He was born on March 11, 1967, attended Christ the King Parochial School in Haddonfield, and graduated from Cherry Hill High School East. He continued his education and received his bachelor's degree in political science from Moravian College in 1989 before enrolling at Seton Hall University School of Law, receiving his juris doctorate degree in 1992. He currently serves as in-house counsel for Remington and Vernick Engineers, and is of-counsel at the law firm of Speziali, Greenwald, and Hawkins.

Louis was first elected as an Assemblyman in 1995, and has been serving as Chairman of the Assembly Budget Committee since 2002. That same year, the Assemblyman sponsored a law designed to lower auto insurance rates for state residents that included incentives for more companies to provide car insurance to New Jersey drivers. The law also resulted in new auto insurance companies entering the state for the first time in more than a decade, lower rates for consumers, and has stopped the migration of companies, such as State Farm, out of the state.

Louis also sponsored a law in 2004 that revised the state's charity care formula to provide greater reimbursement to hospitals that offer health care to the millions of uninsured New Jersey residents. Today, over 1.4 million uninsured New Jersey residents will no longer be denied medical care.

Assemblyman Greenwald also led the effort for the creation of the South Jersey Cancer Center at Cooper University Hospital, which provides care to cancer patients in the state, rather than forcing residents to go to Philadelphia or New York to receive treatment.

During the 2005 election, Assemblyman Greenwald volunteered to take part in a new pilot program called "Fair & Clean Elections." He was the first in the state's history to qualify for the program which was designed to rid the election process of special interests.

The Assemblyman's family has a long history of public service as his mother, Maria Barnaby Greenwald, was the first female mayor of Cherry Hill and served as the first female freeholder for Camden County. Louis currently resides in Voorhees with his wife, Cynthia Ingraldi Greenwald, and their children, Lauren Maria, Jenna Marie and Eric Matthew.
