On April 24, 1973, Governor William Cahill enacted a law (Chapter 83) that created a program for monitoring the campaign finance activities of candidates and other fund-raising committees in state, county and local elections.

The four-member New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission (ELEC) was established to oversee the new law.

At 1 p.m. Tuesday June 18, current and former commissioners and staff members, as well as others who have been instrumental in the agency's success, will gather to celebrate the agency's 40<sup>th</sup> year.

The event will be held in ELEC's eighth floor conference room at the agency's office at 28 West State Street.
