The so-called "Big Six" fundraising committees have raised nearly \$7.2 million and spent \$5.9 million so far this year, higher numbers than the past two statewide elections, according to new quarterly reports filed with the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission (ELEC).

Reports filed by the two state parties and four Legislative Leadership Committees also showed a combined cash reserve of \$3 million on September 30- slightly less than the \$3.2 million reported in July.

Republicans have raised and spent more money than Democrats, though Democrats reported higher cash-on-hand and net worth totals.

Jeff Brindle, ELEC's Executive Director, said while neither of the previous two elections featured a governor's election and the entire Legislature running, it is possible to make a rough comparison.

"If you average Big Six spending for 2009 and 2011, and compare it to the current total, it represents a 17 percent increase," he said.

"This should not come as any shock given the high stakes nature of the election involving the Governor's seat and control of the Legislature," Brindle said.

During the past quarter, the three Republican committees reported heavier spending.
