Your letter dated September 17, 1975 to the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission ("the Commission"), including a request for advisory opinion, has been forwarded to me for reply.

The proposed action of Common Cause as described in your letter of making a \$50.00 contribution to an organization which we assume to be acting to promote passage of the Equal Rights Amendment would not in itself constitute Common Cause a political committee with respect to that public question on the facts set forth in your letter. In addition, communications within Common Cause to its members would not constitute Common Cause a political committee with respect to the public question. Your letter, however, contains a reference to telephone chains to get out the vote. If this includes communications to the general public, then that activity would constitute Common Cause a political committee with respect to the public question within the meaning of the Act, with the resulting pre-election and post-election reporting requirements and the other requirements of the Act.
