Dear Ms. McDonald:

Your letter dated May 17, 1976 to the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission ("the Commission"), including a request for advisory opinion, has been forwarded to me for reply.

Communications by an elected official to his or her constituents do not raise questions of the applicability of the reporting or other requirements of the Act, unless those communications in fact represent expenditures in aid of or support of the candidacy of a candidate. Normally, communications by an elected official are not such expenditures in the absence of special circumstances, such as timing in relation to an election campaign, or the tone or political content of the material, which might call for the conclusion that the communications are in fact expenditures on behalf of a candidate.

Your letter does not suggest that you are at this time a candidate for election. The Commission is of the opinion that the publication by you of "Report To The People", Spring-1976, Volume 1, Number 1 on May 15, 1976 does not constitute an expenditure in aid of a candidate so as to require compliance with reporting or other provisions of the Act.
