Dear Mr. Barno:

Your letter dated October 4, 1976 to the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission ("the Commission"), including a request for advisory opinion, has been forwarded to me for reply. We regret that the press of other Commission business has caused a delay in our response to your letter. Under the Act, you are protected by virtue of your request until receipt of this opinion.

On the facts described in your letter the Barno/Mallon Campaign Committee would be required to disclose the gross income from the art auction in question as contribution and the total of the expenditures, including payments to the Howard Mann Art Center as expenditures.

For the purpose of determining whether a contribution from any contributor exceeds \$100.00, (in which case the name and address of the contributor and the amount of the contribution would be required to be reported to the Commission), the aggregate of the purchase prices paid by any individual contributor would be the amount of the contribution. may wish to include in the report a notation reflecting the amount which the Barno/Mallon Campaign Committee estimated to be the reasonable market value of the painting or paintings purchased by such contributor.

There are no facts which appear in your letter upon which the Commission would challenge the allocation as set forth in your letter.
