In view of the proximity of that election and your references to that election, the Commission proceeded on the assumption that either you or Mr. Tweedle, or both, were candidates in that election. I am since advised by a telephone call from Mr. David Stuerman that neither you nor Mr. Tweedle were candidates in the November 1976 election. In view of those additional facts, and in the absence of facts showing the activity to be in aid or furtherance of the candidacy of any other candidate, the activity will not be regarded by the Commission as subject to the reporting requirements of the Act. Dear Mrs. Danish:

Your letter dated November 11, 1976 to the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission ("the Commission"), including a request for advisory opinion, has been forwarded to me for reply.

The character of the materials involved, the proximity of the date of the publication of the material to the date of the election, as well as other factors, must be taken into account by the Commission in determining whether such material is political in nature and therefore subject to the reporting requirements of the Act.

Based upon the criteria used by the Commission, there is little doubt that one substantial effect, if not a substantial purpose, in the publication of materials of this kind immediately preceding the date of an election is to affect the view of potential voters, as well as the other purpose or purposes stated in your letter.

Accordingly, the Act requires reporting of the expenditure and that the expenditure be made through your campaign treasurer and through your campaign depository.

We regret that the press of other Commission business has caused a delay in our response to your letter. You are of course protected from proceedings by the Commission arising out of the particular facts and circumstances set forth in your request until the date of receipt by you of this opinion.
