Re: The New Jersey Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act, Chapter 83, Laws of 1973 as Amended and Supplemented ("the Act") Your Letter Dated February 2, 1978 Opinion #(0-08-78)

Dear Mr. Hallenbeck:

Your letter dated February 2, 1978 to the Department of State, including a request for advisory opinion, has been forwarded to the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission ("the Commission") for reply.

The Commission does not have authority to advise generally with respect to election laws, since its authority is limited to the area of its responsibility, which is the New Jersey Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act (N.J.S.A. 19:44A-1 and following). This Act forms only a part of the election law of New Jersey, which is contained in Title 19 of the New Jersey Statutes. The remainder of the election law is under the jurisdiction of the Attorney General of New Jersey.

Nothing in the Act prohibits the formation of a payroll deduction plan for the collection of voluntary contributions from a corporation's employees. I am enclosing, however, a copy of the Attorney General's Formal Opinion regarding the payroll deduction plan of the N.J.E.A., which may be of some use to you. Any further questions as to the validity of your particular payroll deduction plan should be directed to the office of the Attorney General.
