The New Jersey Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act, Chapter 83, Laws of 1973 as Amended and Supplemented ("the Act") Your letter dated October 24, 1979 Opinion #0-17-79

Dear Mr. Lustgarten:

Your letter dated October 24, 1979 to the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission ("the Commission), including a request for advisory opinion, has been forwarded to me for reply.

The Commission is of the opinion that some appropriate portion of the expense of the operation of an ongoing computer study of the kind described in your letter must be allocated to the candidacy of the candidates affected. To the extent that the information can be shown by you to be used for the administration of the political party in Bergen County, some portion, and perhaps a substantial portion, of the expenditure would not be required to be included as campaign expenditure, which are allocated to the specific candidate or candidates then seeking office.

We express no opinion as to the applicability of this opinion to the proper allocation of ongoing computer studies or other activities in an election for the office of Governor of the State of New Jersey funded in whole or in part with public funds. We express no opinion with respect to the question whether the use of materials of this kind in a primary election would constitute an unlawful contribution to candidates in violation of 19:44A-11 and 19:44A-33.
