Re: The New Jersey Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act, Chapter 83, Laws of 1973 as Amended and Supplemented ("the Act") Your letter dated October 21, 1980 Opinion \$0-40-80

Dear Mr. Ramer:

Your letter dated October 21, 1980 to the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission ("the Commission"), including a request for advisory opinion, has been forwarded to me for reply.

As you suggest, the Commission has a responsibility to protect the public funds which it must distribute in accordance with the provisions of the Act. In order to avoid risks of improper distribution, as well as fraud as suggested in your letter, the Commission insists on adequate proof to reflect the identity of a contributor of a contribution not in excess of the contribution limit in order to qualify money for matching funds.

One method which the Commission had accepted throughout the 1977 General Election campaign as an adequate proof was the photocopy of the check from each such contributor. Copies of cancelled checks presumably are available to the banks upon which they were cashed, or from the contributors.

We recognize the concern which you may have with respect to unreasonable practical difficulties. In the event that it is shown that production of cancelled checks for those contributors is no longer feasible, signature cards setting forth the facts with respect to the amount and date of such contribution and signed by each such contributor, would be accepted by the Commission in lieu of copies of cancelled checks.
