> Re: The New Jersey Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act, Chapter 83, Laws of 1973 as Amended and Supplemented ("the Act") Your letter dated January 16, 1981 Opinion #0-01-81

Dear Mr. Furnari:

Your letter dated January 16, 1981 to the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission ("the Commission"), including a request for advisory opinion, has been forwarded to me for reply.

It is not entirely clear from your letter what is meant by your statement that you do not expend contributor funds directly to influence legislation. Under the statute of New Jersey, the expenses of preparation of materials which are communicated to legislators and other similar direct dealings with legislatore would be regarded as direct expenditures. In the event that those expenditures exceed \$2,500 during a calendar year, there would be an obligation of reporting under the New Jersey statute. It is not cleer from your letter whether the staff time which you describe would involve such expenditure in excess of \$2,500. (See New Jersey Regulation 19:25-8.5) If you are not clear on the question, I would suggest that you provide us with further detail as to the kinds and amounts of expenditures, and we will attempt to resolve the question for you.

Where accounting is handled through existing bank accounts, the Commission will accept the use of these accounts for the normal lobbying activities. (See New Jersey Regulation 19:25-In such case, it would not be necessary to set up separate accounts.
