Re: The New Jersey Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act, Chapter 83, Laws of 1973 as Amended and Supplemented ("the Act") Your letter dated April 30, 1981 Opinion #0-17-81

Dear Mr. Ricci:

Your letter dated April 30, 1981, to the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission ("the Commission"), including a request for advisory opinion, has been forwarded to me for reply.

The Commission is unable to agree that the value of the combined concert as described would be \$5.00 and that \$15.00 of each ticket price would be matchable. There are a number of ways in which the fair market value of the ticketa for such groups could be ascertained. The expenses for ticketa to performances by these or aimilar groups could be obtained from knowledgable agents, or performers. The Commission does not place any limitation upon the manner in which the fair value of the tickets to such performance may be shown. You should be aware, however, that the use of the cover charge would not be regarded by the Commission as a reasonable way to estimate the fair value. The principal resson for this is that a cover charge, in usual understanding, is a payment made with the anticipation that additional expenditures will also be made for the purchase of alcoholic or other beverages during or in connection with the performance.
