Mr. Herrmann announced that pursuant to the "Open Public Meetings Act," P.L. 1974, c.231, special notice of the meeting of the Commission has been filed with the Secretary of State's office and distributed to the entire State House press corps.

#### 2. Public Financing Certification

Executive Director Herrmann reviewed the public financing certification for the campaign of gubernatorial candidate Peter Shapiro. Mr. Herrmann said the campaign made its submission on Monday, October 7, 1985. He said the Commissioners would be voting to certify \$204,000 to the Shapiro '85 Committee, or a match percentage of 85 percent. He said the \$204,000 figure was derived as follows:
