The Election Law Enforcement Commission has released the names of fifty-seven candidates, eighteen treasurers and two political committees that filed reports in the 1983 primary election and were reprimanded or fined for failure to comply with the Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act. Also released were the names of eight candidates and four treasurers in the 1982 general election who were reprimanded or fined for filing violations; and the names of three candidates and one treasurer in special elections conducted in 1982.

The Commission also announced that it had entered into a settlement agreement with Assemblyman Willie Brown, 29th Legislative District, for reporting violations occurring in the 1981 primary and general elections. Assemblyman Brown received 17 contributions, each over \$100 towards his June 2, 1981 primary election candidacy. He was required to identify those 17 contributions by June 17, 1981, the deadline for the filing of the 15-day post-election report. These contributions were not identified until the filing of a 60-day post-election report on August 19, 1981. In regard to the 1981 general election, Assemblyman Brown received 18 contributions, each in excess of \$100, and was required to identify those contributions on a 7-day pre-election report due for filing on October 27, 1981. contributors were not disclosed until Assemblyman Brown filed a 60-day post-election report on January 21, 1983. Finally, Assemblyman Brown was required to file a 15-day post-election report for the 1981 general election, but neglected to file such a report until January 21, 1983. For these violations, the Commission, with the consent of Assemblyman Brown, entered a fine of \$800, which was reduced to \$400 on the condition that it be paid within 30 days of receipt of the Consent Order. The fine of \$400 was paid.

Summary sheets are attached for the candidates, treasurers and political committees fined in connection with the 1983 primary election, the 1983 school board election, the 1982 general election and 1982 special elections. The summary sheets give the names of the candidates and, where applicable, their treasurers, the public offices they were seeking, the type of report filed, the number of days late, and the Commission action. In regard to the number of days late, where a candidate filed only after the Commission began complaint procedures, the summary sheet indicates only "post complaint." Also, where a candidate has been fined as a previous violator of the Reporting Act, the summary sheets so indicates.

The New Jersey Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act requires that candidates and political committees spending more than \$1,000.0 file reports of their financial activity with the Commission 25 and 7 days prior to an election and 15 days after the election. Candidates spending \$1,000.00 or less are required to file an A-1 Form with the Commission 25 day prior to an election. Where candidates were required to file detailed campai reports (Form R-1), reprimands and fines were imposed jointly on the candidat and their treasurers.

Final Decisions have been mailed to all candidates and treasurers. The publication of this list is part of revised Commission procedures, begun with the 1978 primary election, designed to foster compliance, enhance disclosure and make enforcement more effective.

All candidates are notified by the Election Law Enforcement Commission of their reporting obligations. Candidates who fail to report timely are again notified that reports have not been received. The Act gives the Commission broad authority to initiate enforcement actions against such candidates, committees and treasurers, including civil enforcement and imposition of monetary penalties.

Factors considered by the Commission in levying fines include the number of days the filing is late and any previous violations that are on record with the Commission. In some cases, the Commission has imposed fines with two figures, for example "\$50/25." This means that the Commission has imposed a fine of \$50, which fine will be reduced to \$25 if payment is received within 30 days after service of the Final Decision.
