N.J. Election Law Enforcement Commission

The Election Law Enforcement Commission has released for the 1983 general election the names of 44 candidates, one treasurer and one political committee which were reprimanded or fined for failure to comply with the Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act.

Summary sheets are attached for the candidates and treasurer fined in connection with the 1983 general election. The summary sheets give the names of the candidates and, where applicable, their treasurers, the public offices they were seeking, the type of reports filed, the number of days late, and Commission actions. Where a candidate has been fined as a previous violator of the Reporting Act, the summary sheets indicate it.

Cerria For Mayor was a political committee that supported candidates in the 1983 general election. The committee filed a 25-day preelection report which omitted a contribution and outstanding obligations, a 7-day preelection report which omitted outstanding obligations and a 15-day post-election report which omitted outstanding obligations. For these violations, with the consent of the candidate, Philip M. Cerria, and the committee's treasurer, George Rickerhauser, the Commission entered a fine of \$250/125. The fine of \$125 was paid.

The New Jersey Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act required that during the 1983 general election candidates spending more than \$1,000.00 file reports of their financial activities with the Commission 25 and 7 days prior to an election and 15 days after the

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election. Candidates spending \$1,000.00 or less were required to file a certified statement (Form A-1) with the Commission 25 days prior to an election. Where candidates were required to file detailed campaign reports (Form R-1), fines were imposed jointly on the candidates and their treasurers.

Final Decisions have been mailed to all candidates and treasurers. The publication of this list is part of revised Commission procedures, begun with the 1978 primary election, designed to foster compliance, enhance disclosure and make enforcement more effective.

All candidates are notified by the Election Law Enforcement Commission of their reporting obligations. Candidates who failed to report in a timely manner are again notified that reports have not been received. The Act gives the Commission broad authority to initiate enforcement actions against such committees, candidates and treasurers, including civil enforcement and imposition of monetary penalties.

Factors considered by the Commission in levying fines include the number of days the filing is late and any previous violations that are on record with the Commission. In some cases, the Commission has imposed fines with two figures, for example "\$50/\$25." This means that the Commission has imposed a fine of \$50, which fine will be reduced to \$25 if payment is received within 30 days after service of a Final Decision.
