Final campaign financial figures for the June 2, 1987 Primary election were released today by Fredrick M. Herrmann, Executive Director of the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission.

"Senate and Assembly candidates raised \$3,279,025 and spent 60 percent, or \$1,955,199, of their receipts," stated Herrmann. "Fifty-three percent of legislative receipts, or \$1,736,955, was attributed to the Assembly candidates while \$1,542,070 (47 percent) was raised by Senate candidates. Assembly and Senate hopefuls were equally matched in spending, \$980,022 to \$975,176 respectively."

Herrmann said that a comparison of 1985 and 1987 Assembly races reveals a 30 percent increase in both contributions and expenditures. In 1985, Assembly candidates received \$1,021,146 and spent \$582,913.

No comparisons can be made for the Senate, because Senate elections did not occur in 1985.

"In this year's Primary election," stated Herrmann, Democrats have both outraised and outspent Republicans." Democrats raised and spent \$1,727,373 and \$999,681 respectively while Republicans raised \$1,551,652 and spent \$955,517.

He said that Democratic Assembly candidates received \$880,838, or 42 percent over the 1985 level of \$619,460. Expenditures in 1987 of \$484,413 were 36 percent over 1985 expenditures of \$356,148.

Herrmann added, "Democratic Senate receipts of \$846,535 totalled \$34,303 less than Democratic Assembly receipts. On the other hand Democratic Senate expenditures were \$515,268, or \$30,855 over Democratic Assembly expenditures."

"Over a 100 percent increase occurred in both receipts and spending between 1985 and 1987 for Assembly Republicans," said Herrmann. In 1987, Assembly Republicans received \$856,117 and spent \$495,609 as compared to 1985 receipts totalling \$401,686 and expenditures totalling \$226,764.

He said that Senate Republicans both raised and spent less than Assembly Republicans. Senate Republican receipts and expenditures totalled \$695,534 and \$459,908 respectively.

According to Herrmann, "Overall, incumbents outraised and outspent challengers."

In 1987, incumbent receipts totalled 75 percent over challenger receipts, \$2,086,197 to \$1,192,828. However, 1987 incumbent expenditures (\$1,000,234) were only 5 percent over challenger expenditures (\$954,964).

The 1987 Assembly incumbents raised \$1,063,509, or 58 percent over Assembly challenger receipts of \$673,445. In 1985, Assembly incumbents received over 100 percent or \$686,252 more than challengers did. Challenger receipts totalled \$334,894.

Herrmann said that Assembly incumbents and challengers, in 1987, spent similar amounts, \$490,718 to 489,304. However, in 1985, incumbents outspent challengers by over 100 percent. Incumbent spending equalled \$403,769 while challengers spent \$179,144.

He added that in 1987 Senate incumbent receipts and expenditures exceeded challengers. Incumbents raised \$1,022,687, or 97 percent over challengers receipts of \$519,382. Incumbent expenditures totalled \$509,516, which represents only 9 percent above challenger spending, which was \$465,660.
