Frederick M. Herrmann, Executive Director of the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission (ELEC), announced today that special interest PACs contributed \$7,758,777 to and on behalf of candidates and political committees during 1991. This amount represents a 78 percent increase over 1987, the last year in which both the Senate and General Assembly were up for reelection, when these same groups contributed \$4,358,143.

Herrmann stated, "It is not surprising to see a rise in the amounts of money contributed to candidates by PACs during the most recent legislative election year. Many more special interest groups have formed PACs since 1987 to do their campaign contributing."

The number of special interest PACs filing with ELEC continues to rise steadily each year. In 1991, 290 such PACs filed with ELEC, compared with 228 on file in 1989 and 187 on file in 1987. "Special interest" PACs reporting to the Commission are committees established by corporations, trade associations, businesses, labor unions, professional organizations, ideological, and other special interest groups, located within the State of New Jersey. All four quarters of the calendar year 1991 were tallied to obtain the statistics. Political party committees at the State and local level, as well as personal candidate PACs, were not a part of this study.

Herrmann noted, "It may be difficult to determine the identity of some of the PACs listed because current law does not require them to reveal their true identity. The Commission continues to renew its call for legislation which will provide for greater disclosure of the true interests represented by certain PACs by providing for registration statements."

A PAC is required to file with ELEC when, during a calendar year, it contributes in excess of \$2500 to aid State and local candidates. PACs are required to file with ELEC quarterly.

Contributing by PACs in 1991 was compared not only to the year 1987, when both houses of the legislature ran, but also to 1989, when there was an Assembly and a Gubernatorial race. The amount of money contributed by PACs increased each election cycle, nevertheless, from \$4.4 million in 1987 to \$7.0 million in 1989 to \$7.8 million in 1991.

"Interestingly," said Herrmann, "the larger portion of campaign contributions came from the top 20 PACs." In 1987, the top 20 PACs contributed 58 percent of the total amount given by all PACs; in 1989 that percentage was 60 percent, and in 1991 the percentage rose to 63 percent.

"The trend toward disproportionate spending by larger PACs is very evident when comparing the number one PAC contributor in 1987 and 1991," explained Herrmann. "Just four years ago, the number one PAC contributed \$269,548; in 1991, the number one PAC contributed close to one million dollars," he said. "Having more and more of the money coming from fewer and fewer sources is not a healthy trend," concluded Herrmann.

"These statistics," he remarked, "point dramatically to the need for reform. Over the years, ELEC has called for PAC registration, contribution limits, and the disclosure of the employers of contributors. Unrestricted and underdisclosed financial activity by PACs may be endangering the democratic process in New Jersey."
