Frederick M. Herrmann, Executive Director of the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission, announced today that during the 29-day preelection report period, candidates for the General Assembly reported raising \$6,123,939 and spending \$2,984,426.

According to Herrmann, the figures represent an increase over 1993, the last time the Assembly was up for election. Fundraising increased by 48 percent, up from \$4,137,991, and spending by 33 percent, up from \$2,251,427.

Herrmann noted that comparisons with 1993 are not exact because in that year there were elections for both Governor and State Senate.

Republicans outraised and outspent Democrats in 1995. Republicans raised 37 percent more (\$3,529,241) than the Democrats (\$2,584,063). Spending by Republicans in 1995 (\$1,669,572) was 27 percent higher than the Democrats (\$1,310,167).

Herrmann said: "The gap between Republican and Democratic financial activity at this juncture in 1993 was greater. Republicans raised 41 percent more in 1993 (\$2,383,192) than the Democrats (\$1,689,080). Republicans spent 53 percent more in 1993 (\$1,332,729) than the Democrats (\$869,663)."

Herrmann added: "The activity of Independent candidates is worthy of note. There was a marked decline in fundraising and spending in 1995. In 1993, Independent candidates raised \$65,719 and spent \$49,035. In 1995, Independent candidates raised only \$10,636 and spent only \$4,688. Fundraising by Independents decreased by 84 percent in 1995 while their spending decreased by 90 percent."

Financial activity of Incumbents followed the traditional pattern. Incumbents far outraised and outspent Challengers. Incumbents raised \$4,327,809 and spent \$1,803,611. Incumbents raised 141 percent more than Challengers (Challengers raised \$1,796,130), and spent 53 percent more than Challengers (Challengers spent \$1,180,815).

According to Herrmann, Incumbents raised \$2,875,219 in 1993 and spent \$1,439,977. As of the 29-day report in 1993, Challengers raised \$1,262,772 and spent \$811,450.

Herrmann said that possible explanations for the rise in campaign financial activity reported by candidates includes the historical upward direction of financial activity, the transference of "Personal" PAC money into candidate and joint candidates committees under the new law, and the fact that 1995 represented the first election since 1979 that the Assembly has run alone.

There were three Statewide Ballot Question Committees which filed reports for the General, 1995 election.

The "Political Committee of the Coalition for Better Transportation" raised \$41,857 and spent \$29,640 on Public Question #2, Dedication of Certain Existing Motor Fuels Taxes for the Transportation System in this State.

The "State Mandate/State Pay Coalition" raised \$8,680 and spent \$180 on Public Question #3, Constitutional Amendment Concerning Laws, Rules or Regulations

Which Provide for New or Expanded Programs or Services by School Boards, Counties or Municipalities.

The "New Jersey Coalition for a Clean and Green Tomorrow '95" raised \$88,809 and spent \$42,401 on Public Question #4, Green Acres, Farmland and Historic Preservation, and Blue Acres Bond Issue.

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This press release is a compilation of figures reported to the Commission on the 29-day preelection reports. Only those reports submitted by 5:00 p.m. on October 12, 1995 are a part of this release. If a candidate or treasurer failed to file a report by 5:00 p.m. on October 12th, his/her figures are not included in this release.

The figures contained in this release are subject to change after the reports are more fully reviewed. Although the Commission has taken all reasonable precautions to prevent any mathematical or typographical errors, the possibility that some exist cannot be entirely eliminated. Copies of any report on file with the Commission are available for inspection during regular office hours. It should be noted that the Commission has the ability to arrange the data in various other formats upon request.

Also, please be reminded that certain candidates may maintain a total of two committees per election: a single candidate committee and a joint candidates committee. The figures representing the fundraising and spending by a particular candidate may, therefore, reflect the fundraising and spending of the candidate's single candidate committee plus a pro-rata portion of the candidate's joint candidates committee. For example, if a candidate has a joint candidates committee consisting of two candidates, one-half of the fundraising and spending by the joint candidates committee will be added to the candidate's single candidate committee figures.

Finally, candidates and committees may transfer funds among each other. Although these transfers are compiled in ELEC's statistics, they are not transactions which necessarily create new funds. Nevertheless, ELEC's figures create a useful indicator of overall fundraising and spending in the 1995 General election.
