Frederick M. Herrmann, Executive Director of the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission, announced today that, as of the 29-day preelection reports, fundraising for the 1997 general election increased by 55 percent over the amount raised in 1993, the last year when both Houses of the Legislature, as well as the Governor, were up for election. "Approximately \$13.6 million was raised in 1997, compared to \$8.7 million in 1993," said Herrmann. "It should be noted that these figures, which represent the total fundraising by legislative candidates, include funds carried over from the primary election, as well as other past elections," Herrmann stated. A candidate is required to report "total receipts," which include funds raised during the general election cycle, along with funds carried over from prior elections. The total fundraising figures, therefore, represent the total amount of funds available to be spent by the candidates.

The total amount spent by legislative candidates increased by 31 percent over 1993 spending figures (\$5,603,498 in 1997 to \$4,268,420 in 1993). Interestingly, spending by the Senate candidates increased by 77 percent in 1997, but spending by Assembly candidates decreased by 9 percent. The Senate spent \$3,560,695 in 1997 and \$2,016,993 in 1993. The Assembly spent \$2,042,804 in 1997 and \$2,251,427 in 1993.

The Republicans have raised more than the Democrats thus far in the general election races for legislative office, but the Democrats have spent more. The Republicans raised approximately \$7 million and the Democrats raised \$6.5 million; the Republicans spent \$2.5 million and the Democrats spent \$3 million. The Independents raised only \$7,438 and spent \$4,764; these amounts are substantially down from the 1993 figures (fundraising for Independents is down 93 percent from 1993 figures and spending is down 94 percent).

Predictably, incumbent candidates raised substantially more than the challengers. In 1997, incumbents raised \$9,273,540, or 68 percent of the total amount raised (\$13,599,901). Challengers raised \$4,326,361, or 32 percent of the total amount raised. However, when comparing incumbent/challenger fundraising reported in 1993, incumbents in 1997 raised a smaller percentage of the total funds. In 1993, incumbents raised 74 percent of the total funds raised, to the 68 percent raised in 1997. Accordingly, it appears that challengers are making small advances in their fundraising efforts.

The Senate candidates raised more than the Assembly candidates in 1997, whereas the Senate and Assembly raised about the same in 1993. In 1997, the Senate raised approximately \$7.8 million, and the Assembly raised approximately \$5.7 million. In 1993, the Senate raised \$4.6 million and the Assembly raised \$4.1 million. As to spending, the Senate spent \$3.5 million and the Assembly spent \$2 million in 1997. In 1993, the Senate and the Assembly again spent about the same, \$2 million by the Senate and \$2.2 million by the Assembly.

There was one Statewide Ballot Question Committee which filed reports for the general election. The "Clean Water Coalition, Inc.," reportedly raised \$7,500 and spent nothing (as of the 29-day preelection report) on Public Question #2 (Amendment to the Stormwater Management and Combined Sewer Overflow Abatement Bond Act of 1989) and Public Question #3 ((Amends and Supplements Water Supply Bond Act of 1981).

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This press release is a compilation of figures reported to the Commission on the 29-day preelection reports, due on October 6, 1997. Only those reports filed as of October 10th are a part of this release. If a candidate or treasurer filed a report after October 10th, his/her report figures are not included in this release.

The figures contained in this release are subject to change after the reports are more fully reviewed. Although the Commission has taken all reasonable precautions to prevent any mathematical or typographical errors, the possibility that some may exist cannot be entirely eliminated. Copies of any report on file with the Commission are available for inspection during regular office hours. It should be noted that the Commission has the ability to arrange the data in various formats upon request.

Also, please be reminded that certain candidates may maintain a total of two committees per election: a single candidate committee and a joint candidates committee. The figures representing fundraising and spending by a particular candidate may, therefore, reflect the fundraising and spending of the candidate's single candidate committee plus a pro-rata share of the candidate's joint candidates committee. For example, if a candidate has a joint candidates committee consisting of two candidates, one-half of the fundraising and spending by the joint candidates committee will be added to the candidate's single candidate committee figures.

The term "receipts," as used in this press release, means fundraising for the 1997 general election, as well as funds carried over from the primary election (and other past elections, if applicable). At the 29-day preelection report, a candidate reports the amount of funds carried over from prior campaigns as part of his/her total receipts. This "carry over" figure is reported on page 1 of the Form R-1 (Receipts Table, Line 9) and on page 11 (Opening Balance). Therefore, receipts figures represent all funds available to the candidate as of the 29-day preelection report.

Finally, candidates and committees may transfer funds among each other. Although these transfers are compiled in the Commission's statistics, they are not transactions which necessarily create new funds. Nevertheless, the Commission's preliminary figures create a useful indicator of overall fundraising and spending in the 1997 general election.
